**Visiting the Reserve**

- 1. Plan your visit. The Reserve is open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily, except on Mondays and Tuesdays.
- 2. Bring your own water and snacks. There are no concessions stands at the Reserve.
- 3. Stay on the designated trails. The Reserve is a natural area and it is important to stay on the trails to protect the environment.
- 4. Do not feed the animals. Feeding animals can change their natural behaviors and is illegal.
- 5. Respect the environment. Please do not pick flowers, remove rocks, or damage any plants or animals.
- 6. Leave no trace. Please pack out what you pack in and dispose of your trash properly.

The Rachel Carson Reserve is a component of the N.C. Coastal Reserve, a system of public lands managed by the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources.
